PKEE promotes the Polish Power Sector at the Eurelectric Summit

On 4-5 June in Ljubljana, Slovenia, 500 key representatives of the European energy sector have gathered. CEOs, politicians and businesses discussed current challenges, electrification opportunities and digital modernisation.

The Polish Electricity Association was among the sponsors of the conference and the partner of a discussion track devoted to sustainability. Filip Grzegorzczuk, PKEE's Vice-President and CEO of TAURON Polska Energia S.A. spoke at the panel.

“Access to safe, sustainable and affordable energy is a dream of all European Union Member States and also a goal that Poland is steadfastly seeking to accomplish” – said Filip Grzegorzczuk.

On the first day of the conference, the report on electrification was presented. This fundamental study presents options for a deep electrification of transport, industry and building sectors. The European energy sector is one of the supporters of 2050 emissions cuts through an economy transition. Moreover, the study points out that different starting points across EU countries – in terms of the energy mix, economic situation and industrial activities – will require different pathways and levels of efforts. In Poland, for instance, deep decarbonisation will depend heavily on the commercial availability of key transition technologies.

This annual event was put together by Eurelectric, the top EU power sector organisation. The gathering was exchanging views on state-of-the-art solutions and future applications like electromobility and energy investments. During the summit, the PKEE has also actively promoted its Summer Day taking place on June 6th in the Autoworld Museum in Brussels.

“Electrification of transport is important to the electricity sector, just like balancing the energy consumption and generation at different times of the day and night, and also building new power capacities using cleaner energy sources” – said Pawel Wróbel, Director of PKEE Brussels Office.
